ORDINANCE LEVYING AND IMPOSING TAXES ON ALL PROPERTY SUBJECT TO TAXATION IN THE CITY OF RUSTON, LOUISIANA, AND CALLING FOR SUCH MILLAGE RATE INCREASES BY TWO-THIRDS VOTE OF THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF RUSTON, LOUISIANA, REQUIRED IN PARAGRAPH C OF SECTION 23 OF ARTICLE VII OF THE CONSTITUTION OF LOUISIANA

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF RUSTON, LOUISIANA:

§1. That in order to provide for an increase in millage rate as allowed under LSA-R.S. 47:1705, and in compliance with the provisions of Article VII, Section 23(C), of the Louisiana Constitution and R.S. 47:1705(B), that the City of Ruston, Louisiana, voted to increase the millage rate(s), but not in excess of the prior year's maximum rate(s) on all taxable property shown on the official assessment roll for the year 2016, and when collected, the revenues from said taxes shall be used only for the specific purposes for which said taxes have been levied. Said millage rate(s) are:

§2.
