Bruce Siegmund will run for reelection as Alderman in Ruston

Bruce Siegmund has announced he will run for a third term on Ruston's City Council This Fall, representing Ward 5. Ward 5 represents much of the southwest corner of Ruston, west of Tech drive, and north California Street. Siegmund was first elected in 2014 and was unopposed in 2018.

Siegmund moved to Ruston to attend Louisiana Tech University in 1978 and has lived in Ruston all but 2 years since that time. He loves the community, so he chose to raise his family here. He graduated from Louisiana Tech with his undergraduate degree and an MBA in Marketing. He went on to do some Doctoral work at Tech and Grambling State University. He taught Business at Grambling State University for 19 years and has been in Real Estate sales in the area for 18 years. He is married to Pamela, and is the father of eight children, and grandfather to four.

"In 2014 I ran on a platform to help Ruston grow economically and to partner with Louisiana Tech for collaborated growth and opportunities. We have seen that take place over the last 8 years under Mayor Walker and the current city council. We've maintained and grown quality neighborhoods, while keeping home values up for homeowners. We've also seen problems solved by bringing people together from different kinds of backgrounds.

The city is in excellent financial shape while we continue to invest in our infrastructure and people that improve our quality of life in Ruston. Some of the significant accomplishments I'm proud of include the indoor and outdoor Sports Complex, the Tarbutton Interchange, water wells rehabbed, dilapidated water and sewer lines replaced, Downtown Revitalization, the new farmers market, and over 50 million dollars in grants to Ruston to help pay for improvements. Many improvements are still in the working stage, including the new fire station and Animal Control building. I want to continue to see our Board of Aldermen and Mayor work together for the good of Ruston and the surrounding area. We have a great working relationship with each other as well as local, state, and federal agencies. I want to see those relationships continue and the quality of life in Ruston improve.
